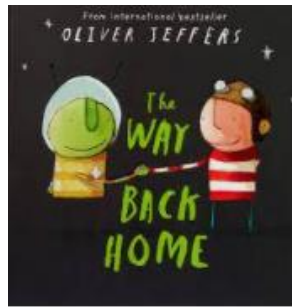
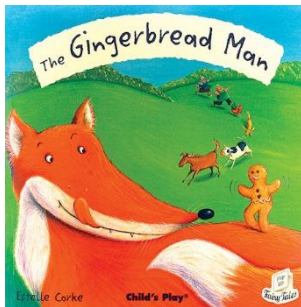
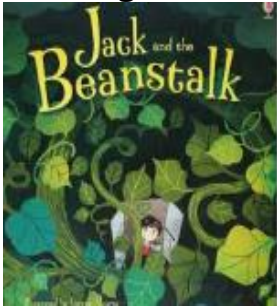
Summer Term 2

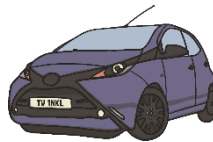
Things you can do at home:
