Use of Pupil Premium in 2013/14

We were allocated £63,445 for the academic year 2013/2014. We receive this money in instalments and these funds are in addition to the main school budget.

Priority

To narrow the disadvantage gap by raising attainment of pupils from low income families and those in the care of the local authority.

We recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or group of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged and/or are of a vulnerable nature.

Success Criteria

Targeted additional support which enables all pupils, however financially or socially disadvantaged to :

- improve attainment levels and rate of progress
- close attainment gap relative to school averages for non-FSM and non-LAC averages
- have full access to curricular and extra-curricular activities

We used this funding to:

- Reduce class group sizes in Year 3 and 4, thus improving opportunities for effective AfL and accelerating progress.
- Providing individual work with an experienced teaching assistant focussed on overcoming gaps in learning. All of our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving children to at least age related expectations
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through trained TAs, pastoral care or external agencies
- Fund high quality training for teaching assistants on specific interventions
- Extra adult support to support emotional development in Nurture sessions & small group interventions.
- Fund wrap-around care where appropriate
- Provide experiences in order to broaden horizons for pupils eligible for FSM or of hard pressed means such as visits out of school.
- Provide subsidies towards visits, experiences and residential opportunities for pupils eligible for FSM or of hard pressed means.

IMPACT

ATTAINMENT:

EYFS: 10 pupils in the cohort

30% pupils in this group achieved a Good Level of Development (GLD). This is lower than the previous year for this cohort Local Authority GLD for this group which was 39.6%.

Year 1 Phonics Check: 7 pupils in the cohort

71% of the pupil premium cohort achieved the expected standard in Year 1 and 57% of the non-pupil premium cohort achieved the required standard.

KS1: 8 pupils in the cohort :

Percentage of pupils in this group achieving Level 2b+ (age related expectation) was 75% (reading) 62.5% (writing) and 87.5% (maths) compared to 62.5% (reading), 51.5% (writing) and 63.8% (maths) in Leeds. Total Average Point Score for this group was 16.2 compared to 14 in Leeds. This compares well with results from the previous year where the Pupil Premium Cohort had an Average point score of 15.8.

We have closed the attainment gap at KS1 between PP pupils and non-PP pupils. This year there is no difference in total APS (16.2 APS for both groups).

(In 2013 there was a difference of + 0.7 APS for non PP pupils compared to +0.9 APS difference in 2012 and +2.2 in 2011.)

KS2: 10 pupils in the cohort : 100% of pupils in this group achieved L4+ in Reading, Writing and Maths compared to 82.8% in Leeds. Average point scores for this cohort was 30.0 compared with 29.6 for non PP pupils. APS for the PP in Leeds was 26.5.

Progress

Analysis from school data for each year group shows that overall pupils in receipt of pupil premium make outstanding progress in S&L; Reading; Writing; and Maths and that this is in line with progress for other identified groups and in line with each year group cohort as a whole.

In Reception, progress for this cohort is never less than good in 7 out of 12 of the areas assessed and outstanding in 4 out of 12 areas assessed. Progress in number is in line with expectation.

In KS1 as a whole, progress for this cohort is outstanding in all areas.

In KS2 as a whole, progress is outstanding in Speaking and Listening and maths and good in Reading and Writing

When Year 6 SATs are analysed, of the cohort of Y6 pupils who were eligible for Pupil Premium. The % of pupils making expected progress between KS1 and KS2 was as follows:

○ School Reading	91%	Leeds 88%	National 89%
○ School Writing	100%	Leeds 91%	National 91%
○ School Maths	100%	Leeds 87%	National 86%
