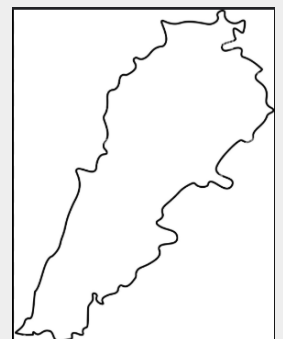
School Uniform Exchange

Dog Fouling

It has been reported by a number of parents and staff that there is often a lot of dog mess on the pavements outside of school and on the pavements and tunnel.

We are sure that the vast majority of parents are responsible pet owners but if you do bring your dog on the school run, we ask that you clear up behind them.

We have also contacted the council and requested signage to be put up on Primrose Hill, however we are not confident that this will deter those dog owners who do not clear up their dog’s mess.

LKS2 - Someone from school has sent you a nasty message online. What should you do?

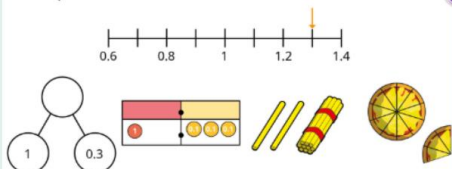
UKS2 - A classmate sends a picture to your phone which makes you feel uncomfortable. What should you do?
