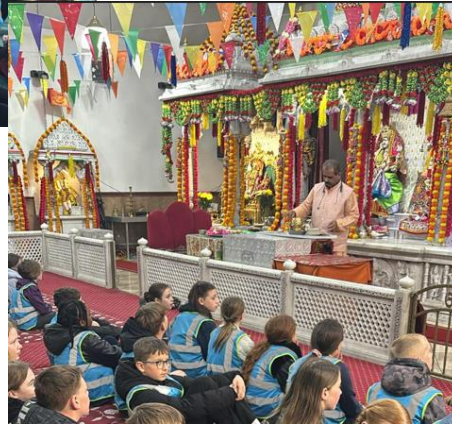
## Year 2 visit to Pudsey Parish Church

## Eco Committee Non Uniform Day - Friday 25th April

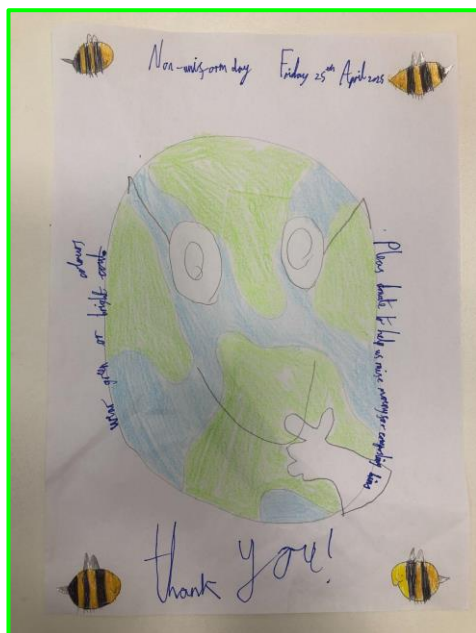

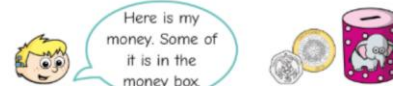
