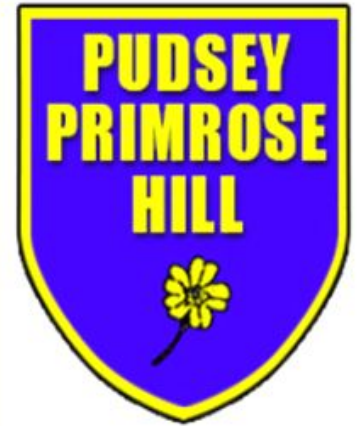

## School Street

Primrose Hill is a Leeds City Council designated School Street. Many of our parents are familiar with this and the vehicle restrictions it brings. This is a brilliant initiative which has been in place for a number of years now and was implemented to keep all children, parents, staff and residents safe at the beginning and end of the school day.

This is a good opportunity to reiterate the restrictions that the School Street allows and ask for all parents to ensure anyone who drops off or collects their child is aware of this.

**The School street is closed to all vehicles during the times displayed \*8.15 -9.10am and 2.40 - 3.40pm)**The only exceptions are Blue Badge holders and residents who have a permit. Parents cannot access Primrose Hill in a vehicle during the times that the street is closed. Any vehicles driving on the school street **MUST** drive at 'walking pace' in order to ensure the safety of everyone.

There is a concertina barrier at the end of the street, this is put out at the beginning and end of the time restrictions when the road is closed to vehicles. We try to work together to limit any disruption and if the street is clear of people, the barrier is removed as soon as possible.

School staff are positioned in the street at the beginning of the school day and we aim to have staff at the end of the street near the barrier. Unfortunately, there have been occasions when staff have received negative comments and unpleasant behaviour when they have asked drivers to wait / not drive onto the street. **This is unacceptable and we ask everyone to respect these staff members.** School staff then accompany the children into school and our site manager removes the barrier.

We are determined to keep Primrose Hill a safe space for our children and families to wait before and after school, please support us in this.

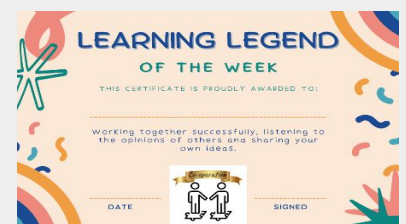
## Primrose Hill Learning Legends

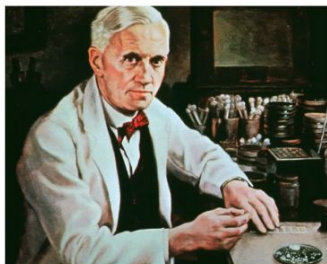

### 15th September 1928
