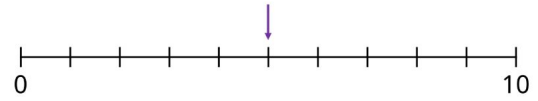

Talk to your friends, teachers, school staff and families about this week's Talk On. **Challenge:** Once you've talked about it, can you write about it?

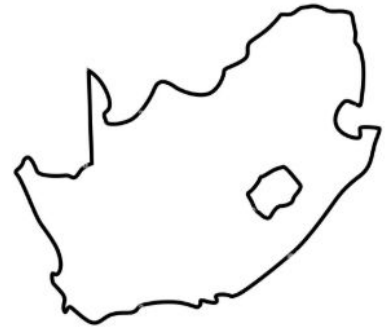


# WHERE IN THE WORLD
