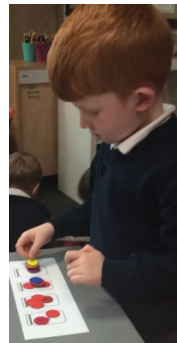
Wellbeing idea for the week: Take time to pause and notice positive things around you.

We have been incredibly busy this half term and have managed to do lots of exciting things we would like to share with you. We have spent time in the orchard, both collecting rotten apples to begin our composting and have taken some of the fresh apples along with rhubarb, onions and carrots that were growing in our allotment over the summer and Miss Wiechula and Mrs Vickers dropped these off at the Pudsey Community Project, they were so grateful for our continued donations and we are looking forward to supporting them again with our ASDA Heroes project this year.

Speaking of the ASDA Heroes project, some of our Eco-Committee went to the ASDA Merchandising Centre of Excellence in Leeds last week to take part in the launch event for this year's project. We were so proud to return as last year's winners and now there are even more schools involved in the project across Yorkshire which is wonderful. We spent time listening to what ASDA are doing about helping the planet, and completing activities. One of the activities we were challenged with was a 'make it' task where the team decided to make musical instruments for children out of recycling which they won a sweet prize for. We left the event feeling very inspired, with a plan about how we are going to help the community and our school for this year's project.

We have also teamed up with the Friends of Primrose Hill to try and begin to sort out all the lost property at school which is in our school reception area. All of the eco-committee spent time going through the clothes with names and returning them to children around school. We then bagged up the remaining clothes into ages ready to be sorted by the wonderful Friends of Primrose Hill. 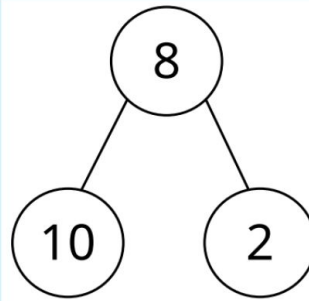
