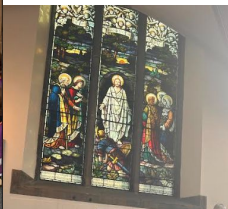

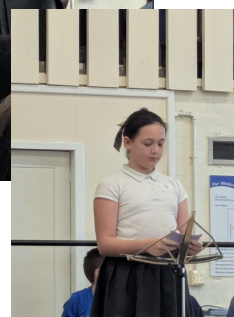
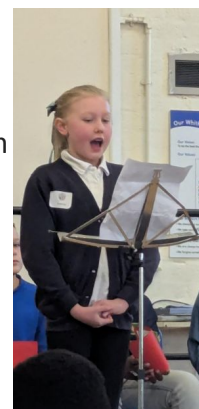

How does what children learn in primary school impact or support the job you do (not necessarily English and maths skills, but perhaps organisational skills, working collaboratively, understanding of science / history / the arts etc).

What do you want to do in the future? Do you have any plans to develop your career or change the job you do? If so, why and what will you have to do to achieve this?
